



School WellSpot Tobacco-Free Policy Sample

This policy is in alignment with La. Rev. Stat. §17:240 (A) and (B). Highlighted portions of this sample document note the amended changes.

In order to meet the school tobacco policy criteria, the policy must include these elements:	
☐ Provides rationale for tobacco use policy	
□ Prohibits tobacco use on school property used for educational purposes (facilities owned, leased, or rented by the organization, including parking lots)	
□ Does not include designated smoking areas	
☐ Defines tobacco to include all types of smoking and smokeless tobacco products	
□ Includes smoking devices (e-cigarettes)	
☐ Requires referrals to tobacco cessation resources	
☐ Requires enforcement for violations	
☐ Prohibits tobacco use in school buses and school vehicles (if applicable)	







Rationale

The	Board of Education recognizes that the use of tobacco products is a health
safety, and	environmental hazard for students, employees, visitors, and school facilities. The
board believ	ves that the use of tobacco products on school grounds, in school buildings and
facilities, or	school property or at school-related or school-sponsored events is detrimental to
the health a	and safety of students, staff and visitors. The Board acknowledges that adult
employees	and visitors serve as role models for students. The Board recognizes that it has an
obligation to	promote positive role models in schools and promote a healthy learning and
working env	rironment, free from unwanted smoke and tobacco use for the students,
employees,	and visitors on the school campus. Adopted

Policy

Smoking and use of any tobacco product is prohibited

No student, staff member or school visitor is permitted to use any tobacco product at any time:

- in any building, facility, bus, or vehicle owned, leased, rented or chartered by the [Name of School District] Schools;
- on any school grounds and property including athletic fields and parking lots owned leased, rented or chartered by [Name of Board of Education]; or
- at any school-sponsored or school-related event on-campus or off-campus.

In addition, school district employees, school volunteers, contractors or other persons performing services on behalf of the school district also are prohibited from smoking and using tobacco products at any time while on duty and in the presence of students, either on or off school grounds. Further, no student is permitted to possess a tobacco product while in any school building, while on school grounds or property or at any school-sponsored or school – related event or at any other time that students are under the authority of school personnel.

This policy shall not apply to any school property that is rented, leased, or otherwise made available for the use of non-educational purposes.

Definitions

"Smoking" means possession of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or any other lighted tobacco products; including but not limited smoking objects or devices relative to e-cigs, e-cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, advanced personal vaporizers, vape pens, vape mods.

"Tobacco products" includes cigarettes, cigars, blunts, bidis, pipes, chewing tobacco, snuff, and any other items containing or reasonably resembling tobacco or tobacco products.

"Tobacco use" includes smoking, chewing, dipping, or any other use of tobacco products.

Accountability

Procedures

An enforcement protocol, which identifies consequences for students, staff and visitors who violate the policy, will be created and communicated to all students, staff and parents.

Opportunities for Cessation

The administration will consult with the health department and other appropriate health organizations to provide students and employees with information and access to support systems, programs and services to encourage them to abstain from the use of tobacco products. One such service students or staff may be referred to is the Louisiana Quit-Line (1-800-QuitNow), which is a free counseling service for tobacco cessation.

Prevention Education

The administration will consult with appropriate health organizations to identify and provide programs or opportunities for students to gain a greater understanding of the health hazards of tobacco use and the impact of tobacco use as it relates to providing a safe, orderly, clean and inviting school environment.
