Deliver and support quality clinical services that bridge treatment, prevention and health promotion.

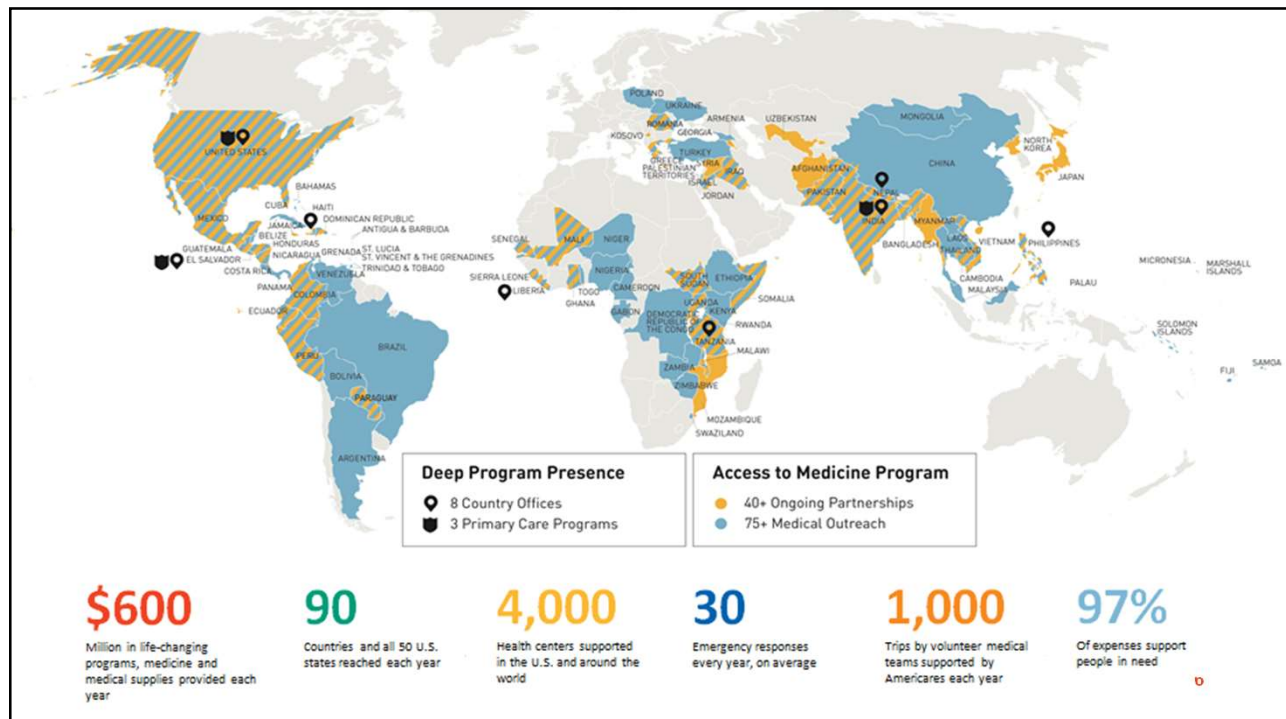


Community Health

Design and implement clinic- and community-based programs to deliver sustained health improvements.



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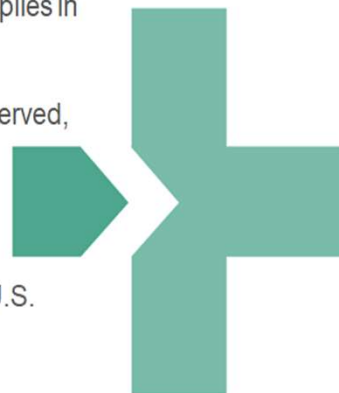
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US Programs Access to Medicine

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Access to Medicine

- Largest supplier of donated medication and medical supplies in U.S.
- Over **900** safety net health care partners serving underserved, low-income populations
- **Over 200** pharmaceutical donors
- More than **\$200 million in aid** donated last year in the U.S.
- **Free** for centers and their patients
- Complement existing medication access programs



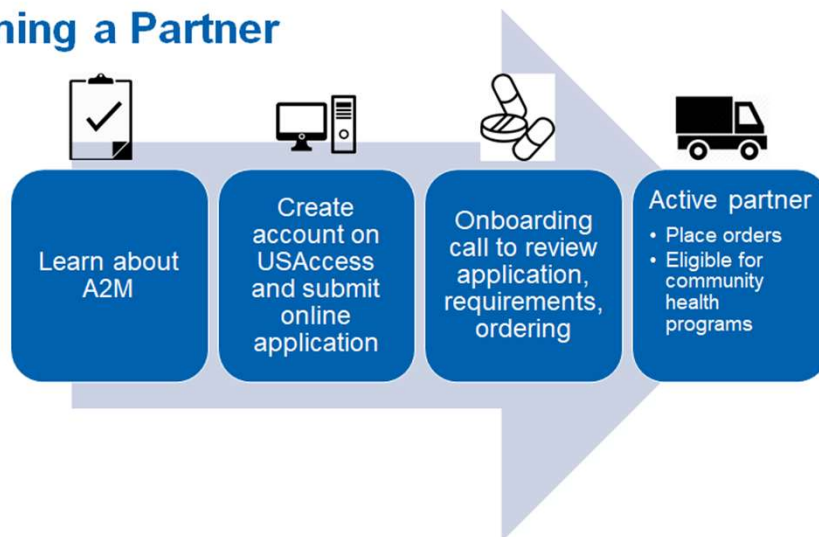
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Policies

- **Patient Eligibility**
 - Uninsured or underinsured AND below 300% FPL
 - Underinsured = public or private ins. but cannot afford copays, no drug coverage
- **Dispensing**
 - Provided for free to eligible patients
- **Storage**
 - Segregated from other donated or purchased medications
 - Stickers, signage
- **Tracking**
 - By lot number to the patient level
- **Destruction**
 - Expired products to be destroyed
 - Cannot be returned to manufacturer for credit

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Current Modules for Disaster Recovery

Psychological First Aid (PFA)

This abbreviated PFA training provides information on how and when to provide psychological first aid to people impacted by a traumatic event, and ways to enhance provider care before, during and after a traumatic event.

Resiliency and Coping for the Healthcare Community

To support those who have been effected by a disaster or traumatic event and how to cope with related stressors.

Self-Care Strategies for the Busy Health Professional

The goal of this training is to increase the ability of providers to identify natural emotional responses to crises and learn to manage stress reactions and improve self-care for themselves and among the people they serve.

Specialized Populations:

Caring for Vulnerable Populations Affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic

This training provides guidance on how health care workers can support the unique physical and mental health concerns of high-risk vulnerable groups during the COVID-19 pandemic.

This training provides guidance on how grief affects children and teens at different developmental stages; how COVID-19 has impacted this; the importance of normalizing.

This training provides an overview of the common reactions children exhibit when facing an emergency, typical stress responses, and how to communicate with and support children in regaining a sense of security.
