Deficiencies



Standard Level:

 Standard level deficiencies are deficient practices that pose low threat to health and safety. Must be resolved with in 60 calendar days from the date of survey.

Condition Level:

- Condition level deficiencies are deficient practices that pose a serious threat to health and safety. Must be resolved within 45 calendar days from the date of survey.
- Multiple standard level deficiencies could lead to a CONDITION level citation.

Immediate Jeopardy:

 Immediate Jeopardy is an immediate threat to health or safety and requires immediate attention and resolution.



Medication Vials





Single dose vials being utilized as a multidose vial. Most cited - Lidocaine

Single and multi dose vials found stored past the manufacturer printed expiration date

Open multi-dose vials stored past the 28 day Beyond Use Date

Refrigerated multi-dose vaccines and tuberculin (TST)

Check open vials on a regular basis or use basket method



Sterilization of Instruments





- The clinic is not following their process for handling and sterilization of non-disposable instruments.
- The clinic is not following the MFU for the autoclave.
- The clinic is not following their policy for accepting sterilized instruments from the hospital or other outside source.
- Cold sterilization is not acceptable.



Patient Care Equipment & Supplies



- Patient care equipment is not checked according to manufacturers instructions for use.
- Exam bed covers have frayed corners or tears in the cover.
- Broken or obsolete equipment not labeled "Do Not Use".
- Patient care items stored directly on the floor.
- Single Patient Use Items such as Suture Removal Kits, Sterile Water, Normal Saline, Iodoform Gauze, Steri-Strips



Point of Care Tests





- Clinic must have the ability to perform all 6 required point of care tests. Hemoglobin or Hematocrit, Blood Glucose, Pregnancy, Urinalysis by stick or tablet, Culturing, Occult blood in the stool.
- Most common tests the clinic is unable to perform are:
- Hemoglobin or Hematocrit No equipment and/or supplies
- Blood Glucose not using a meter for Multiple Patient Use
- Testing for occult blood in the stool Providing mail in test only
- All reagents, strips, controls, etc., must be in date these are expired or not present in the clinic



Emergency Services



- A list of medications approved by the Medical Director and NP or PA is missing from clinic policy.
- Approved medications are missing from the emergency medication kit.
- Expired medication and supplies found in the emergency medication kit.
- No emergency medication kit found in the clinic.
