Mental Health First Aid

Mental Health First Aid is the initial help offered to a person developing a mental health or substance use problem, or experiencing a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate treatment and support are received or until the crisis resolves.

This program takes the fear and hesitation out of starting these conversations by improving understanding and providing an action plan that teaches people to safely and responsibly identify and address a potential mental illness or substance use disorder.


Why Mental Health First Aid

- (MHFA) prepares participants to interact with a person experiencing a mental health crisis.
- MHFA is an evidence-based public education program that introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental health challenges, and builds understanding of
- Appropriate detection techniques, interventions, and resource and referrals.
- Teaches an action plan to identify and respond to signs of mental health or substance use challenges among individuals living in rural communities
